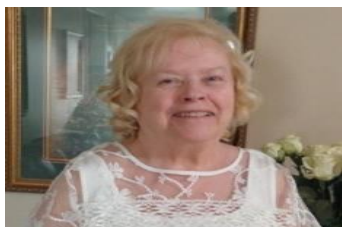

Environment collection for March

One of the items that we are collecting for the Environment Community Service Program this Year is Soles 4 Souls, a program that the previous Conservation Committee has supported.

Soles 4 Souls turns unwanted shoes into opportunity by keeping them from going to waste and putting them to use-providing relief, creating jobs, and empowering people to break the cycle of Poverty. Soles 4 Souls protects the environment by putting used goods to good use, instead of Wasting away in a landfill.

Since 2006 Soles 4 Souls and partners Bomba socks, Macy's, Foot Locker, and Zappos have Kept more than 46 million pairs of shoes from going to the landfill. The micro-enterprise Business model sells used shoes to impoverished people, mostly women, in over 50 countries. These women have gone from barely making it to buying land, building houses, and feeding Their families. They can improve the dynamics of their family and community, and it isn't charity. Support this Program by bringing gently used shoes-men, women, and children's, to the next Woman's Club Meeting.

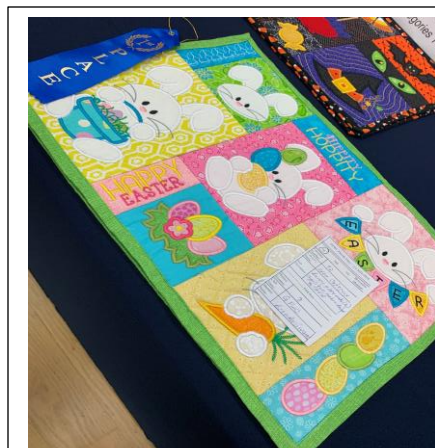

St. Patrick's Day Trivia Questions and Answers

1-Why is St Patrick celebrated on March 17?

A: It is the day St Patrick died in 461 AD, who is the patron Saint of Ireland.

2-Where and when was the first St. Patrick's Day Parade?

A: St. Augustine, Florida in 1601. The area was then a Spanish colony, but had an Irish Vicar

4-Where and when was the first St. Paddy's Day celebration in the British American colonies?

A: Boston in 1737. It was a dinner held by the Charitable Irish Society, the oldest Irish society in America, which still holds a dinner on March 17 today.

4-Where and when was the first St. Patrick Day parade in Ireland?

A: 1903 in the Irish town of Waterford, followed by Dublin in 1931.

5-According to Irish lore, what animal did St. Patrick drive out of Ireland?

A: Snakes. Among the legends associated with St. Patrick is that **he stood atop an Irish hillside and banished snakes from Ireland**—prompting all serpents to slither away into the sea. In fact, research suggests snakes never occupied the Emerald Isle in the first place. There are no signs of snakes in the country's fossil record.

6-What are the odds of finding a 4-leaf clover?

A: Google states 1 in 10,000.

7-What is the highest number of leaves ever recorded on a single clover stem?

A: 56, according to the Guinness Book of World Records and was discovered by Shigeo Obara of Japan.

Palm Sunday, St Patrick's Day and the Date of Easter

In 1940, an unusual coincidence took place when Palm Sunday (which is one week prior to Easter Sunday) occurred on the same day as St Patrick's day. In Ireland, which has St Patrick as its patron saint, people were able to wear both the shamrock and the palm on the same day.

St Patrick's Day falls on March 17 but Easter Sunday, and hence Palm Sunday, moves according to the rules that determine Easter.

Easter Sunday falls on the first Sunday after the full moon occurring on, or after, the March equinox (taken as March 21). So for Palm Sunday and St Patrick's Day to be on the same day, March 17 must fall on a Sunday (on average 1 in 7 years) AND there must be a full moon on either March 21, 22, or 23. The interval between successive full moons is approximately 29.5 days and so the chance of a full moon on any of these three dates is 3 in 29.5. This makes the combined chance of both Palm Sunday and St Patrick's Day coinciding as approximately 1 in 69 years (a probability of 0.015 per year).

This is only a statistical (ie, average) estimate. So are we actually due for a repeat of this coincidence shortly? The answer is no because the next such occurrence is in the year 2391 - almost three hundred years from now. Beyond that there is another coincidence in the year 2475, making only two such occasions in 500 years, very much less frequent than the average expected.
