As we celebrate and enjoy this Holiday Season with family and friends let's remember those who are less fortunate and alone.

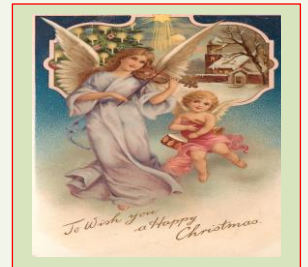

Environment Community Tips

Save Money-Tips to Make Your Fresh Food Last Longer

Bread - keep fresh by placing a piece of celery stalk in the bread bag and seal tight. Bread becomes stale when it loses moisture. The celery releases moisture and the bread absorbs it keeping it fresh longer. Yet, if the bread does go slightly stale use it to make French toast, croutons, stuffing, or crumble it and add spices to make breadcrumbs.

Milk - spoils when bacteria grow and causes an odor. Just add a pinch of baking soda when the container is first opened and shake it to let the baking soda dissolve. No taste, no odor and the milk lasts a week longer.

Berries - often get moldy. Simply wash them lightly in a 4 to 1 water to apple cider vinegar solution. Vinegar neutralizes mold. Let berries dry completely before refrigerating. Berries need to breathe so place them back into the grocery container with slits. Turn over every couple days. Enjoy berries a week longer. Or freeze them for future smoothies.

Cheese - needs to breathe. So rewrap slices and place fresh cheese in wax paper which is breathable and then refrigerate for freshness.

Lettuce - wilts when it loses water. Soak lettuce in ice for 15 minutes so that it reabsorbs water and refreshes.

Bananas - start ripening quickly because ethylene gas releases from the stems. Wrap stems with plastic wrap or aluminum foil then hang from a hook which slows down the gas process and keeps them from bruising. Ripened bananas can be placed in the fridge where the cool temps keep them from ripening further. Single bananas should be peeled, either kept whole or sliced, then placed in the freezer in re-sealable airtight bags. Great for smoothies or making banana bread in the future.
